Miami, FL— City of Miami Mayor Manny Diaz and City Commission Chairman Joe Sanchez today joined Miami-Dade County Mayor Carlos Alvarez and Miami-Dade County Commissioner Jose “Pepe” Diaz for the Opening Ceremony of the Moving Wall, a half-size replica of Washington, DC’s Vietnam Veterans Memorial.

“We are honored to host the Moving Wall in Miami, in honor of the fallen soldiers in the Vietnam War, as well as other wars. I invite all of the residents of Miami to visit the exhibit and pay tribute to our veterans,” said Mayor Diaz.

The memorial is located. at Bayfront Park, 301 North Biscayne Boulevard, in Downtown Miami by the Mildred & Claude Pepper Fountain. The Moving Wall, which has toured the country for more than twenty years, **will be free for residents to view from Friday, November 7, through Veteran’s Day, November 11.**
